## Free Admission at the Nanaimo Museum and Bastion for International Museum Day

Nanaimo - The Nanaimo Museum is celebrating International Museum Day on Saturday, May 18 with free admission at the Nanaimo Museum and Bastion. International Museum Day 2019 is an opportunity for museums around the world to showcase their role as cultural hubs. The Bastion's summer season also kicks off on May 18 and runs through Labour Day.

Nanaimo Museum is open daily 10:00am to 5:00pm from May long weekend to Labour Day weekend. Admission, including to Nanaimo Mysteries, is free on May 18. Regular admission is \$2 for adults, \$1.75 for seniors and $\$ 0.75$ for children.
